June 12, 2017

The Palmetto A's Model A Board meeting was held at Tom Barnes's community clubhouse with the following in attendance: John Cockerill, Twila Cockerill, John Begg, Lauren Eckstrom, Dick Fraser, Wes Porterfield and Tom Barnes. Cheryl Austin was unable to attend.

The minutes for the May meeting were read by L. Eckstrom and a motion to approve the minutes was made by J. Cockerill, seconded by J. Begg, and approved. T. Barnes gave the treasurer's report. The website has been rebuilt and is back up. T. Cockerill spoke about the newsletter. There is a new header, and a decision was made to list awards on the web page, rather than in the header as this was taking up a great deal of space. A request was also made for emails regarding any mistakes in the newsletter to be sent to T. Cockerill for clarification as well as for story contributions, for example, the "Tiny Tips" section. D. 



SERVICE STATION ATTIRE IN THE MODEL A ERA

In the early years of the automobile, getting gas for the horseless carriage was no small feat. Dispensing gasoline evolved from bulk depots on the outskirts of towns, often requiring three people to fill the tank, to curb side pumps. As the popularity of the motor car increased and technology allowed larger quantities of fuel to be refined from the same amount of petroleum, merchants of all stripes, from bicycle shops, general stores, garages, and automotive dealers, installed gas pumps in front of their establishments. By 1920 approximately 15,000 gas stations were located in the United States. They were rudimentary at best, some little more than shacks, with advertisements littering their walls and the roads leading to them. They were considered by many to be an eyesore, and even worse, there was little confidence in the product they offered.

Major oil companies took note and began to standardize their stations, making them visually appealing to the motorist. Not only did the station need to look good, the service employees needed to project honesty, integrity, reliability and quality. What better way to do that than through the clothing they wore?




Ford Service Bulletins emphasized service, shop cleanliness, and the appearance of the employees. This illustration, from the July 1928 Bulletin, shows the serviceman in a shop coat, with the Ford Logo, shoes polished, and cap in hand.

Cook's Corner....

"Lazy Man's" Pie - Peach Cobbler

- 1 stick butter
- 1 cup milk
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 cup flour 1 teaspoon baking powder Dash of salt
- 1 quart fruit, sweetened (peaches, cherries, blackberries, etc)

Melt butter in baking pan. Mix flour, sugar, baking powder, salt and milk. Pour batter in pan on top of butter; cover with fruit. DO NOT STIR! Batter will rise to top as it bakes and absorb the flavor of the fruit. Bake at 350 degrees for one hour. Serve warm with whipped cream or ice cream. So easy!




Leveling a Manifold

Picture this: it's Saturday afternoon, you find that you need to reinstall your intake/exhaust manifold, so you run a straightedge and it's a tad bit warped. Of course your local machine shop is closed.

Take the sandpaper off of your belt sander, cut it and lay it on a really flat surface. Glass is good – so is sheet rock. Duct tape about 1/4" all the way around. Flop the manifold over and hand sand the manifold. 60 or 80 grit works well. Try not to keep more pressure on one side over the other, and I sand in long ovals rather than straight back-and-forth. Check after a few strokes and you can see your high spots! It may not be as good as a machine shop but it will get you back on the road!

Photo of transporter, Ken Dover, of Inman, SC delivering our Deluxe Phaeton to the Model A Ford Museum in Hickory Corners, Mi. this week. Car is going to be displayed as part of a "Model A's around the World" exhibit. While I cannot document that it was actually built in England, I have the original bill-of-sale from Manchester, England in 1931, where it was sold to an officer in the Royal Army. He kept the car until the '60's when it was sold to a US Air Force officer who brought it to the states. My dad restored the car in the late 60's & early 70's, and won many national awards. He sold it in 1972. The car then stayed in Gaffney, SC until the owner passed away in 2006. His son called me looking for an appraisal. Not only did I appraise it, I bought it and it has been part of my small collection since. Sherry & I are extremely proud to have our car in the museum, and look forward to visiting while it is there.
