





Cook's Corner

Apple Lollypops (Candied Apples)

12 small red or green apples, any variety

12 wooden skewers

3 cups white sugar


1/2 cup light corn syrup

1 cup water

1/2 teaspoon red food coloring (optional)

Wash apples and remove stems. Stick skewers upright in stem end of each apple.

Put sugar, water corn syrup and food color in deep small saucepan. Cook over low heat until sugar id dissolved. Bring to boil and let boil undisturbed until a few drops poured into cold water becomes brittle (hard crack stage). Place pan at once over another pan of boiling water, dip apples one at a time in hot syrup, twirling to coat evenly. Place upright on a greased pan and cool until hardened.

I don't know about you, but I'm still waiting for the weather to change! I long for crisp mornings and warm afternoons. Cooler temps and little less rain would be great, too.


