The meeting will be held in the Austin's new barn. We are reminded that even though there is some heat in the new barn, please dress warmly.


Danny and Cheryl will be making their famous chicken bog and the membership will bring the sides (A-L) and dessert (M-W).


Parking: There is plenty of parking space. Please leave the driveway for those that have mobility issues so they may park closer to the barn. It is okay to park on the street.





Jim's Tech Tip by Jim Cannon, MAFCA Technical Director

Care of Nickel Plating

If you have a 1928 or '29 Model A, and it has nickel plating (as original), you may have noticed that the nickel is a bit more work to maintain than chrome. Don't let it go too long or you will have a hard time getting the finish back.

The best cleaner that I have found for nickel is a polishing paste in a tube out of Germany called "Happich Simichrome Polish". It also does a great job on chrome. Apply it with a clean cloth, work it in and clean the metal well, then polish with a microfiber cloth. Not only does it polish, it leaves a protective film on the metal to keep it looking nice longer.

Most of our Model A parts suppliers, such as Bratton's, Snyder's, and Mac's, sell it. Check with your favorite parts guys.



Cook's Corner...

I'm reprinting this recipe because I inadvertently left an ingredient out when I put it in the December 2018 newsletter. Sorry!

Chocolate Covered Peanut Butter Balls

2 sticks butter, melted1 box powdered sugar

11/2 cups peanut butter

1½ cups graham cracker crumbs 1 tsp vanilla

12-ounce bag Nestle's semi-sweet chocolate chips
Block of paraffin (used for canning)

Thoroughly mix the first five ingredients and roll into 1" balls. Place in single layer on cookie sheet and freeze.

Melt chocolate chips. Add paraffin shaved from block a little at a time until you get a smooth consistency.

Dip frozen peanut butter balls in chocolate with dipping fork or twopronged meet fork. Place on wax paper lined pan until chocolate is set. Store in refrigerator.


Happy New Year!




