



According to fashion experts 1931 was the year for the well-dressed woman to wear pajamas as vacation garb. The trend toward pajamas became apparent several months prior to 1931 when women began to buy them for trip wear where motor travel lasted several days. They were light and cool and the gay colored cretonne from which they were made was exceedingly durable and withstood the hardships

of traveling. Designers also came out with styles suitable for house wear, beach wear, and gardening. The outfit shown here was designed with beach wear in mind. It is a two piece ensemble, including a slip over sweater and pajamas of navy blue. The red lacings and white buttons are the finishing touches that made it tremendously smart.

In May, 1931 Will Rogers was playing "Connecticut Yank-ee" and the Show Shop in Los Angeles was featuring a drama plus a five act Vaudeville Show.

TINY TIPS

From TINY SNELL

When installing a window regulator handle make sure that the handle is installed so that it is on the downward travel when window is closed tight. This will prevent any possibility of the weight of the handle slightly lowering the window when traveling over rough roads.


The restored Model 'A' often develops squeaks shortly after restoration due to settling of the body and compression of the anti-squeak material between body and frame. This can be corrected by retightening body bolts during the first few months of service.

Flickering head lamps have long plagued Model 'A' owners. This may be due to slight corrosion forming on the contact points on the headlamp connector plug. This condition can be remedied by cleaning the contacts. Many of the connector plugs are warped due to spring tension on the contacts. This can be corrected by unsoldering and removing the contact ends and inverting the insulator disc and unsoldering the contacts.

After long and diligent search for tubing which would make satisfactory replacement for the radiator outlet pipe # 8291B, a tail pipe was found which was bent to produce three outlet pipes. This tail pipe is for Plymouth 1949-1952 models P18, P20 and P23.



Over the years since the Model A Youth Restoration Award program (MAYRA) was founded in 1995, your club has been a generous contributor and we thank you so very much. We want you to know that your contributions have meant a great deal to our young restorer beneficiaries.

Since its inception, MAYRA has made over 75 individual awards to youth restorers. Prior to 2016, we normally made 9 or 10 awards biennially. 


