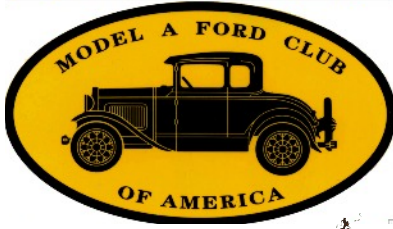

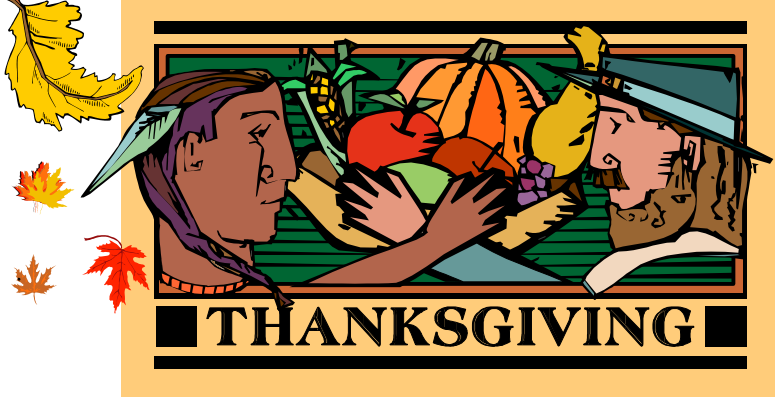

Palmetto A's Board of Directors Meeting

October 15, 2018

President Happy Begg opened the meeting at 5:30 pm at her home in Irmo, SC, with the following in attendance: Cheryl Austin, Tom Barnes, Happy & John Begg, Sharon & Orville Booth, John & Twila Cockerill, Lauren Eckstrom, Dick Fraser, and Wes Porterfield.

Discussion was held concerning the upcoming Christmas Party to be held on December 8th at the Lexington Villas Club House with the food to be provided from Hudson's Smoke House with Cheryl Austin choosing the side dishes. The drinks which were purchased for the canceled Swap Meet will be available, but the prizes purchased will be saved for the annual March Picnic. Members will provide appetizers and desserts according to alphabetical division. Cost will be \$5 for members and \$12 for non-members. Dressing in vintage fashion is encouraged with \$25 prize for each winning couple as well as the individual male and female not part of the winning couple, and a \$5 prize for the winning child. A White Elephant Exchange will be held as well as the Model A Ford rendition of the 12 Days of Christmas performed by chosen members.

Treasurer Tom Barnes distributed a copy of the current TD Bank Statement with income and expenses noted which was reviewed and approved.

Fall Trends for Women

The following examples are taken from the September 1931 issue of *Women's World*. The article showed women what to expect with new fall fashions. For daytime wear, skirts are about twelve inches from the ground, for afternoons the smart length is about nine inches from the floor, and for evening, down to ankle length. A waistline is still shown in all styles. Ensembles consisting of a skirt and a coat or a frock and jacket are considered to be in style. A black woolen dress is a wardrobe staple. Serge and Cheviot wools are for dressing in high style. Crepe satin is for both afternoon and evening wear. Canton crepe, flat silk crepe, serge-like silk, silk and wool novelties in small patterns are fashionable. The satin crepes, semi-sheer crepes and transparent velvets are for the afternoon mode. The dominant colors this fall are garnet-red for town wear and yellow-red for evening. Brown is the second choice to black for daytime and dinner wear.

Noted in an article from the November 1931 issue of *Women's World*, there is an increased width above the waistline. The high waist, accentuated bust, and width across the shoulders, are features of the Empire style, "so important for this season." The bottom left dress shows the same dress fabric used to add a cap on the sleeves, creating a broadening effect to the shoulders. The style shown fourth from the left, accomplishes the same thing with the well used bertha collar, also broadening the shoulder area. Skirts are close fitting about the hips, pleated, gored or only slightly flared at the hemline. All bias-cut garments needed length to give them a graceful appearance and thus the hemlines were longer in 1931. Dresses favored diagonal lines, and there were often angles where the bodice was attached to the skirt, in order to accomplish the 'bias' look.

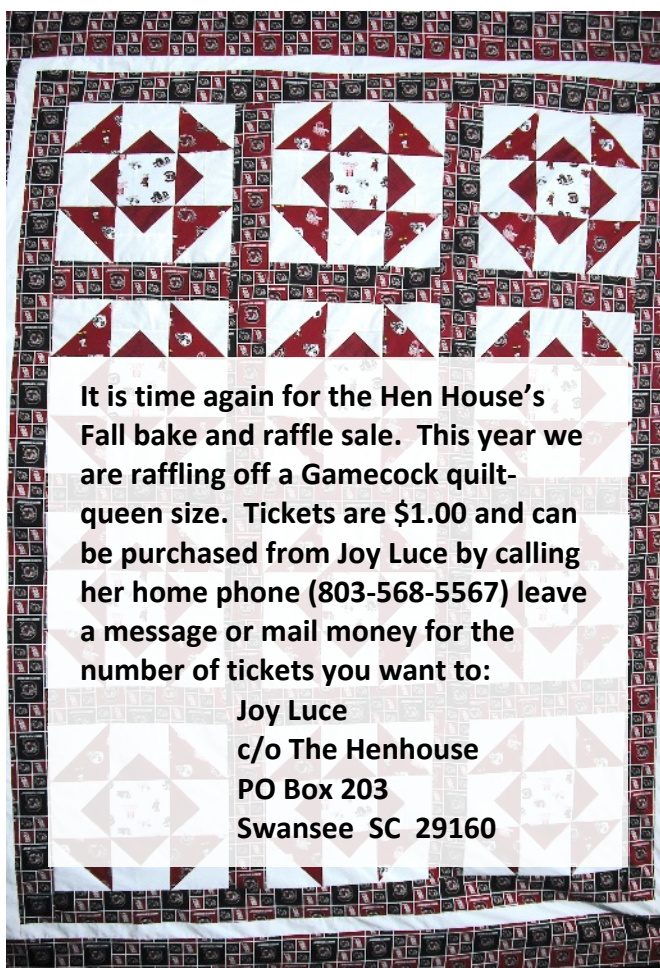


Cook's Corner

Squash Casserole

- 4 to 6 cups sliced yellow squash
- 1 medium onion, minced
- 1 can cream of chicken soup
- 1 cup sour cream
- salt and pepper to taste
- 1 package Pepperidge Farms herb stuffing
- 1 stick butter, melted

Heat oven to 350°. Cook squash and onion in a small amount of water for about 20 minutes. Mash. Add salt, pepper, sour cream and soup. Blend well. Stir melted butter into stuffing mix until stuffing mix is well coated. Spread a little more than half of the stuffing in a 3 quart greased casserole. Spoon squash mixture over stuffing and spread evenly. Cover with the remaining stuffing. Bake at 350° for 40 to 45 minutes.

Jim's Tech Tip

While My Oil Gently Drains

Every time you drain the engine oil to change it, while you are waiting for all the dripping to stop, may I suggest you add the following simple items to your oil change routine?

- Check the ignition point gap with a 0.020" feeler gauge. Adjust if required. Look at the points to make sure they still look good (not pitted or burnt).
- Wipe off the ignition cam with a rag. Now put a small dab of fresh cam grease on 2 of the lobes of the ignition cam.
- Put a drop or two of light oil in the little oiler on the side of the distributor. If you have the cam screw with the hole drilled in it, put a drop or two in there, too.
- Put a couple of drops of engine oil in each hole on top of the throttle assembly that is bolted to the back of the engine.
- Check the fan belt for tension.

That's it! In the time it takes for the oil to all drain out, you have taken care of several little routine maintenance items on you're "A" that will help keep it running well and avoid a problem on the road.

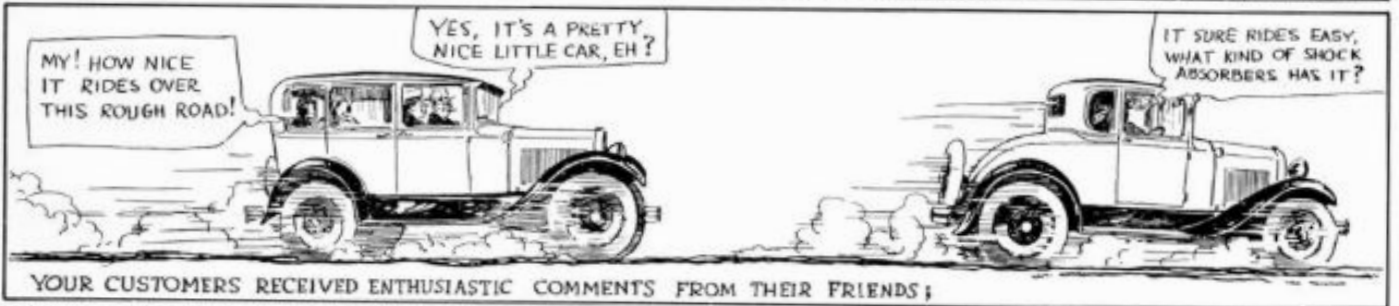



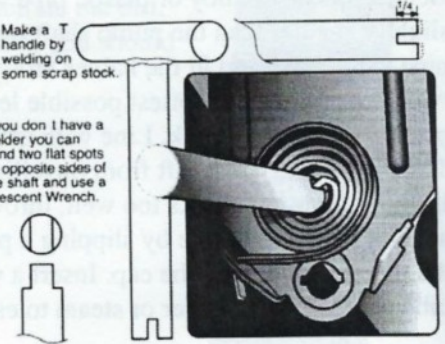
WINDOW REGULATOR SPRING TOOL

Sometimes a window regulator spring will either break or become so weak that it makes it hard to roll up the window. Installing a new spring can be difficult and also dangerous.

Take an old distributor shaft and weld on a T handle made from rod stock. Grind down the slotted end so the slot is only 1/4" deep. Put the regulator in a vise and wind it until the lift arm is all the way up. This is the position in which the spring is least compressed. Hook the outer hook of the spring and insert the tool in the center. Turn the tool to compress the spring until it fits into the slot. Release the tool. Tap the spring into position with a hammer.

Make a T handle by welding on some scrap stock.

If you don't have a welder you can grind two flat spots on opposite sides of the shaft and use a Crescent Wrench.
