

This month's Cook's Corner recipe comes from a Taste of Home collection of The Great Depression Era recipes.

Cook's Corner.....

Vinegar Pie

Pastry for double crust pie

2 cups sugar

3 tbs all purpose flour

¼ to ½ tsp ground nutmeg

½ cup butter, cubed

⅔ cup white vinegar

1 quart hot water

Preheat oven to 450°.

Whisk together sugar, flour and nutmeg; set aside. On lightly floured surface, roll one-third of pie dough to ¼ inch thick circle; cut into 2X1 inch strips. Layer a deep 12 inch enamel coated cast iron skillet or ovenproof casserole with half the strips; sprinkle with half the sugar mixture. Dot with half the butter. Repeat crust, sugar and butter layer.

Roll out remaining two-thirds pie dough to ¼ inch thick circle. Place over filling, pressing against sides of skillet or casserole. Cut a slit in top. Add vinegar to hot water; slowly pour vinegar-water mixture through slit. Liquid may bubble through crust, this is normal. To catch spills, line oven rack with foil.

Bake until crust is golden brown, about an hour. Cover edge loosely with foil during the last 15-20 minutes if needed to prevent overbrowning. Remove foil and cool on a wire rack.

Grease!

The Model A Ford has numerous grease fittings sticking out all over the car just begging to be greased. However, one area Henry failed to consider is the two parking brake levers on the rear wheels, each with a pair of bushings.

Even though the bushings see little wear, they should be greased. Trying to oil them is difficult. There is a way to install grease fittings. The modification has been around for years and is something worth doing. It is best approached when doing a brake job when the rear brakes are apart.



The above photo shows a pair of brake levers with grease fittings installed. Drill from the end of the shaft with a nominal 1/8" drill bit down to a point between where the two bushings ride and cross drill it. Then drill the end of the shaft with a 5/16" drill bit about 3/8" deep.



Press in type grease fittings and the insertion tool

Press in grease fittings and the tool to insert them can be obtained from Bratton's. The part number for the grease fittings is 36740 and the part number for the drive-in insertion tool is 36810; page 160 in their catalog.

Using the tool, hammer the grease fittings into the end of the shaft where you drilled the 5/16" hole and the shafts are then ready for installation.



The above photo shows a grease fitting in service on a vehicle driven daily. Give it a shot of grease whenever greasing the car.

Jim's Tech Tips "Mounting Wheels"

I know that my Dad reads these Tech Tips, so today's is a special shout out to him, who taught me this Tip for mounting wheels when I was about 12 years old. Thanks, Dad!

Start with a classic X-style lug nut wrench. If you don't already have one, mine is 20" across and works quite well.



Place the wheel/tire next to the vehicle, leaning it against the hub and brake drum you plan to mount it on. Adjust the jack so that the wheel needs to be lifted an inch or two onto the studs.

Now slip two of the tire iron arms under the tire, one arm to the left of where the tire touches the ground, and the other arm to the right. Grab one of the tire iron arms that is pointing toward you, and lift the tire up with one hand while you guide the wheel to hang on a stud or two with the other hand.



Hold the wheel in against the drum while you lower the lug wrench and use that free hand to start a lug nut on one of the studs. Once you have that lug nut started, you can let go of the wheel and start the rest of them. Use the tire iron to run them all in snug, then lower the jack and tighten them all again.

This Tip is not just applicable to mounting a wheel/tire on a Model A. It works on pretty much any vehicle: car, truck, trailer... In fact, the larger and heavier the wheel/tire is that you are putting on, the bigger help this is.

So in the shop or out on the road, use a simple tire iron to help you lift a wheel up into place and hold it there while you start the lug nuts.
