

The FORDOR—

Now in Production

THE Fordor Sedan is the de luxe car of the new Ford passenger car line and has many new and exclusive features. The cowl sweeps down in a graceful curve to a narrow belt moulding which runs from the front of the hood on a straight line back and around the car, giving a long, low effect.

Adding much to the appearance is the roll belt effect below the windows and which rolls down to the narrow moulding. The top and rear quarter, with rounded corners, are covered with a pyroxylin coated material of a tan shade, in pleasing contrast with the body colors.

Nickeled windshield frame and a nickeled moulding at the juncture of the cowl and hood are other bits of refinement. Ventilators are found in the lower panels of the cowl on either side. The hardware is all nickeled in a conservative style of scroll effect and of uniform design.

The height of the body is 48% inches and height of the car from the road is 70% inches. There are 4 color options. Besides the special features described, the standard equipment is the same as included in other Model A Cars. Price, \$570 F. O. B. Detroit.



Restoring Fuel Level Indicator

After spending over 80 years inside the gas tank of my 1930 standard coupe, the fuel indicator was looking pretty sad. Paint was missing from the numbers and the overall appearance was dingy and tarnished. I decided to see if I could bring it back to life.

Since the numbers are actually stamped into the indicator, lower than the surrounding surface, I figured I might be able to flow some new paint into the recesses, wait until it dried, and try to rub the paint off the top surface, leaving just the numbers painted. It worked like a champ. Here's what I did.

I gathered up a small artist's brush, a tiny cup, and some <u>fuel proof</u> paint. This is the same model airplane paint recommended to repaint your carburetor. After shaking the paint up for at least a full minute, I squirted some into the small cup.



Getting just a bit of paint on the tip of the brush, I let the paint flow into the recesses of the numbers where they had been chipped or eaten away over the years.

Once the paint had thoroughly dried, I looked around for something to rub the surface with. I decided against a cloth as being too floppy and

might actually pull the paint back out of the recesses. I needed something smooth but stiff. A scrap piece of pine, from another project, laying on my work bench caught my eye. A sort of burnishing tool. Perfect!





I rubbed it over the now dried paint and it not only took off the unwanted paint around the numbers but it had a sort of polishing effect on the metal as well.



Whatever the surface of the indicator is plated with, it came right back, shiny as new and the numbers looked terrific (the lovely hands belong to my wife. I'm manning the camera.)

This is going to look great, even behind the old, original bezel.

After cleaning and polishing the inner and outer rings as best I could, my gas gauge is



ready to be reinstalled in the fuel tank and give another 80 plus years of service.

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Cook's Corner...

PECAN PIE BROWNIES Ingredients:

1 box Brownie mix, must have instructions for making in 13x9 pan + ingredients listed on the package
Pecan Pie Filling:

1 cup Sugar

1 dup Sugui

1 1/2 cups Light Corn syrup

4 Eggs

1/4 cup unsalted butter

1 1/2 teaspoon Vanilla extract

2 cups Pecans, roughly chopped Instructions:

Preheat oven according to brownie package instructions.

Mix brownies according to package instructions. Pour brownie batter into a greased 13x9 inch pan and place in the oven to bake for 20 minutes.

Whisk together the sugar, corn syrup, eggs, butter, and vanilla in a small saucepan. Place on the stovetop over medium-high heat and begin to cook, stirring continuously.

As the brownies bake, the filling in the saucepan should have thickened enough to coat your spoon (about 15 minutes). Stir the pecans into the mixture and continue to cook for 2-3 minutes until the mixture reaches the consistency of runny oatmeal. You want it to be loose enough to pour over the brownies but not liquid.

When the brownies have finished prebaking remove them from the oven and pour the pecan pie filling over them spreading it out to cover the brownies completely. Place them back in the oven and bake for 25-30 minutes or until the filling only jiggles slightly in the middle when you move the pan. Let cool to room temperature before cutting.



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
